

# The McMichaels of Allegheny County, Penn.

This genealogy was assembled by William H. McMichael, of Brookline, MA. There were several editions of the genealogy, which he referred to as "Series." He worked with several collaborators including my Aunt Nellie Hays Schall. He recruited his collaborators by sending out letters to people with the McMichael surname in the western Pennsylvania area.

I have fragments of several of the series, but the one reproduced here, the eighth series, may have been the last. Many of the copies in my possession are not in good condition, or are so marked up as to make them confusing. In the era before computers or even the photocopier, William had to prepare his manuscript using a typewriter. In order to prepare multiple copies he used onion-skin paper with carbon paper between the sheets. This, however, yields a fuzzy print on the paper, and the onion-skin paper is very fragile.

In some editions of this genealogy it is stated that the William Walker, whose daughter Nancy Jane married John McMichael, is connected with the Gabriel/Isaac Walker lineage. Although there is a section on collateral lines in this genealogy, there appears to be no known linkage between these two Walker lineages. This is a conclusion that both my cousin William Vogel and I reached independently after trying to track down many leads.

These are Work Sheets, Series 8, on which will be found the outline of the descendants of James McMichael, his wife Priscilla, and family, who came to Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, at a date which is no later than 1787. This material comes in part, from a History of Allegheny County (1889), by A. Warner, and from sundry other printed sources. But by far the major part of the attached data, comes from the personal records of seven contributors, descendants of the first James, and their names are noted herewith:-

THE McMICHAELS OF ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENN.

Sheet Series B, Page 1. These are work sheets, on which the developing data is outlined to the contributors. It will of course, be necessary from time to time, to retype these sheets, and to reshuffle the numbers, as new names and new lines of descent are added. This then, will replace all previous sheets, which can be discarded. And these new numbers should be used for reference, for any corrections and queries, when referring to the individuals in any line of descent.

There are two ways in use, by which the numbers are developed, for the identification of the various individuals of the family, but both have their shortcomings. One method is to take the children in order, thruout any one generation, from parent to parent, until all are recorded, and then on to the next generation. The other method is to take one parent--one ancestor--and to develop his line of descent from generation to generation, before going on to the next ancestor. We will use a combination of both, using the best, but without entering into a discussion of their merits or demerits. So that in any number such as 4B-87, the number 4, is the generation, counting from the first settler in America; the letter B represents a grouping of descendants from the children of one ancestor, and the whole number 87, indicates the particular individual.

The count of the generations is based on the first settler in the United States. In the case of this family group, the first James McMichael, while being the first settler in Allegheny County, Penn., is not necessarily the first settler in the United States. But we will estimate that there were two generations before him, and we will give to the first James of this group, the generation of 3, and will correct it when future research uncovers his antecedents.

Our basic information on this family group, comes from a History of Allegheny County, Penn., (1889), by A. Warner, in two volumes. I was able to obtain photostats of the McMichael data from the library of the Daughters of the American Revolution, in Washington, D.C. There were four entries to the McMichaels, one each on Pages 18 and 587, and two entries on Page 475, both in Volume 2. The entries concern two different groups, one the descendants of John McMichael, and the other the descendants of Isaac McMichael. No attempt is made in the history, to tie them together, although it is noted that both came from Maryland. It will be shown later, that they were brothers.

One of my early letters on this group, dated for March 27, 1957, was sent to Mr. Ewing McMichael (7B-86), of Tyre, Penn. Being elderly, he turned the letter over to his daughter, Mrs. H. B. Thackerich, (2B-131) of Box 370, R.D. 5, Crafton Branch, Pittsburgh, Penn., who is a descendant of Isaac thru John (1796-1853). In her first letters, she indicated her interest, and in subsequent letters, forwarded data. Since then, she has continued to work on various parts of the data, and has also put me in touch with others, who have contributed data.---With respect to the founding of the McMichael family, in the Pittsburgh area, she notes her grandfather, John Jr. as saying, that these brothers came from

Cecil County, Maryland. Then as they moved west, one brother remained just west of the mountains, another came to Allegheny County, and another went still farther west.---If there were in fact, 3 brothers, it is possible that he referred to the generation which precedes John and Isaac, mentioned above. James then, the father of John and Isaac, would be one of the three.

Another of the early letters in this area, dated for April 17, 1957, was addressed to Mrs. A. W. McMichael of McKeesport, Penn. Here again, did Mrs. McMichael (7E-110) refer the letter to another,---to her niece, Mrs. Louise Gardner Jamieson (8E-170), of 1834 Beech Street, McKeesport, Penn., who is a descendant of Isaac thru William.---In her outline of the early members of this family group, she shows Isaac and John as brothers, and sons of a father who was named John or James. It will be shown later, that the father's name was James McMichael.

A third correspondent to join the enquiry, was Mrs. Martha S. Jeffries, who makes her home with her older son, at 7708 Waverly Street, Pittsburgh, 21, Penn. She is a member of the D.A.R., and was invited to join the group by Mrs. Huebnerich. And I was surprised on June 2, 1957, by the receipt of a Registered Letter, containing many pages of valuable data.---Her statement as to the founding of the family in this area, is to the effect, that James McMichael, with two sons, John and Isaac, came to Washington County, Penn., from Maryland, in 1779, or, by other reliable information, from southeast Pennsylvania, in 1782. That portion of Washington County, later became Robinson Township, in Allegheny County. We identify Mrs. Jeffries in the descent, a 7E-103.

A fourth correspondent joined the enquiry in August of 1957, when Mr. Robert H. McMichael (7C-413), of 1513 Obey Avenue, Pittsburgh, 5, Penn., responded to one of my letters. And as I explained to him in my reply, his was a most welcome answer, since he is descended from John, on which descent we were shy of information.---But he offered no suggestions as to the founding of the family.

A fifth correspondent joined our group in February of 1958, when Mrs. Nellie H. Schall, of 519 Nifflin Avenue, Pittsburgh, 21, Pennsylvania, forwarded data, which represented original research into the wills of several members of the family. She was invited to join by Mrs. Huebnerich. She is twice related to the McMichael family; first, in that her sister, Alma Hays, married a descendant of John McMichael (4C-3) of whom we speak in these opening statements---(see John and Alma, 7C-414); and secondly, that her full cousin, Myrtle Stewart, daughter of Allie Hays Stewart, married Lawrence McMichael (7B-105)

A sixth correspondent entered our enquiry in February of 1958, when a Mr. J. H. McMichael (8E-144a), of 4022 Madison Street, Hyattsville, Maryland, answered one of my general letters of enquiry. He is a descendant of Alexander (6E-30), thru Lawrence H. (7B-105). Knowing that Mrs. Huebnerich of Pittsburgh was in contact with some of the McMichaels in Virginia, I informed her of my new contact, and she immediately forwarded her Virginia data, so that Mr. J. H. McMichael would not be to any unnecessary trouble to do the work, which might have been previously finished. As it turned out, it was his line of descent which we needed, and it was forwarded subsequently thru Mrs. Schall.

Our seventh correspondent joined the group on August 27, 1958, when a Mrs. Florence McMichael Jones (7C-415), c/o The Crystal Springs Brook Trout Company, of Port Allegheny, Penn., forwarded a considerable amount of new material. She came into the enquiry at the invitation of Mrs. N. H. Schall, and forwarded records, which, I am told, were originated by Mr. William Sturgeon Vogel (8C-406a).

It is evident then, from a study of the opinions of the correspondents, as above, and from a recorded will, that one James McMichael was the ancestor of the Allegheny County, Penn., branch of the McMichael Clan. It is taken from various sources, that he and his family came from Cecil County, Maryland,---but noted by others, that after the survey of the Mason & Dixon Line, that a portion of that county became southeastern Pennsylvania. It is a technical point perhaps, to note, that at the time of the 1790 Census, that there were no McMichaels in Maryland, and other sources of data give none. So that if our branch of the family did come from Maryland, they left behind them, no heads of families, in the form of relatives. On the other hand, southeastern Pennsylvania was one of three areas in which the Scotch-Irish made their settlements, and that is probably the correct information.

It is certain that James McMichael came west with his two sons, John and Isaac, and probably with his entire family. And they were in this area at a date which is no later than early 1787. For we find in Volume 4, of the Western Pennsylvania Historical Magazine, Pages 84-93, the text of a petition to the legislature of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and signed by many pages of names, requesting the right to their own county, and asking for the erection of Allegheny County. This petition is dated for Feb. 15, 1787, and is signed, among others, by Isaac & John McMichael. This will establish beyond question, their presence in the county in that year,---and perhaps somewhat earlier, since the conditions which they list, and which made it advisable for them to have their own county, must have existed for some time prior to the date of the petition.

In Volume 7, Page 48, of the Pennsylvania Genealogical Society Publications, we have found the abstract of the will of the first James, as filed in the present Allegheny County. The will was dated for July 16, 1788, and was proved on Jan. 20, 1792, indicating that his death would have occurred about the turn of the year 1791-92. Witnesses to the will, were George Vallandingham, John Bail and George Bail. The will would indicate that,---

34-1. James McMichael, came west with his wife Priscilla-----, his family, and her girl "Mary Ham." It is not clear from the abstract, as to whom this girl may be,---but she is presumed to be a maidservant, and in Chafant's history, "A Goodly Heritage", she is named Mary Hammond. By this marriage, there were 2 sons and 3 daughters, which are listed herewith, in the order of their mention in the will, but not necessarily in the order of their birth,---

The dates which are given in the foregoing listing, are not found in the will:- the dates for Isaac are from his headstone; the dates for John are from the records of Bernice McMichael Gardner (7B-111); and the dates for Abigail and Elizabeth, are by Mrs. W. H. Schall. The marriage of Elizabeth is from the will; the marriage of Abigail is by Mrs. Schall.----- The William Marks Sr., mentioned above, was one of the first ruling elders of the Mt. Union Presbyterian Church, and he died on Dec. 1, 1824, at the age of 73 years. John Bail, a witness to the will, was one of the first settlers of the county.

It is also worthy of note, that the name of John McMichael (4C-3), son of the first James, was mentioned in connection with the wills of four other men in that area:- As 1 of 2 executors, and as 1 of 3 witnesses, to the will of George Bail, died Sept. 1802; as executor of the will of Jacob Ferree, who died in August 1807; as 1 of 2 executors to the will of Mr. Robert Miller, who died in April 1811; and as 1 of 2 witnesses to the will of Robert Greenlee, who died in late 1811.

(The Jacob Ferree, mentioned above, was apparently a man of prominence, since one of the Chapters of the D.A.R. is named after him, and of which Mrs. Schall is a member.)

4E-2. Isaac McMichael (1756-1823), who by his headstone, died on Feb. 6, 1823, is stated to have come over the mountains with his family, at an early date---but at a date which is no later than 1787. By the history he is said to have taken land in Robinson Township; Mrs. Jameson states that the land was close to the present Ambridge, Penn. But she states further, that Isaac, being injured while clearing land, gave up his claim for a horse, and went to join his brother John, at Carnegie, Penn., some 30 miles distant. (However, in giving up the land, Isaac appears to have made a serious mistake, since the land was later found to be rich in oil.) On joining his brother, he was given title to half of the latter's land. Mrs. Jeffries quoted the terms:- That John McMichael and wife of Robinson Township, Allegheny County, to Isaac McMichael of Robinson Township, in Allegheny County, for a consideration of \$2000. transfers 313 acres of land, being a part of a tract of land called Danwick, which the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by patent, dated January 12, 1814, granted to John McMichael the same being enrolled in Patent Book H Vol. 10, Page 106. It is recorded on March 18, 1819, in Deed Book 2 d AC26, Page 95.

Isaac McMichael was married to Miss Mary Holtz, according to the history book. But a deed which Mrs. Ruenrich has seen, the name was Marion Holtz. In her headstone she is named Miriam Holtz (1761-1846), and is said to have died on Sept. 21, 1846.

4E-3. John McMichael (1761-1840), who died on Feb. 6, 1840, was in this county "prior to 1820" by one statement in the history. In an account of the United Presbyterian Church, it was stated that he was 18 yrs. of age when he came to this county. In any event, the petition for the traction of Allegheny County, would fix the date at no later than early 1787. He took up land on what is known as "Danwick Acres", close upon the present Carnegie, Pennsylvania, some five miles west of Pittsburgh.

John deeded one-half of his land to Isaac, his brother, and the latter's land continued in the family, undivided, until the time of William John McMichael (6E-31)

The families of the foregoing Isaac and John McMichael, were then, the ones to carry on the Clan name, after the death of their father James. In the year 1957, Mrs. Huenrich paid a visit to the old homestead which was built on Isaac's land, and found it beautifully restored by the present owner, and furnished with modern, early American. The foundation of the old barn also remains, and is in use.---The first log house on the land, was built on a knoll, called McMichael's Knob, from which one can see for many miles. There is a road of late, that runs thru the farm, and new houses are being built along it. This land was known formerly as Danwick Acres.

Of John's share of Danwick Acres, we have no record. But after the death of the first Isaac, there were four heirs mentioned, John, William, Jane and Sarah,---altho' the girls did not share in the distribution of the land. In 1851, John (son of Isaac) bought out his brother's, William's share, and the entire 313 acres came into his possession. When this John died, the land went to his wife and children; when she died in 1853, a guardian was appointed until the children came of age. For the final distribution of this land, look to his section in the reading.

The church with which the McMichaels were associated, in the early days, was known as the Old Mt. Union United Presbyterian Church. Mrs. Jeffries and Mrs. Jamesson have contributed the data on the church, and which comes in part from personal knowledge, partly from a booklet which was issued at the Centennial Celebration of the Church, in 1894, and partly from the headstones in the cemetery.---There were two prior congregations in the same general area, known as Robinson Run, and Pittsburg (no relation to the city of the same name.), under the Second Associated Reformed Presbytery of Penn., which was held on Oct. 14, 1793, and for which a supply of preaching was desired. But the formal opening of the church with which we are concerned, was in 1794, including the installation of the Rev. Riddle, on the 15th of August of that year! He was to act as pastor not only for this church, then entitled Robinson Run, but also for the Steep Hollow congregation.

The first shelter was a tent, 8 X 10 ft., for the preacher and the choir, with seats for the congregation, on the outside, and made of logs. The next shelter was a log cabin, built in 1794, in the shape of a Greek Cross, and having an audience chamber of 20 X 50 ft. It stood in the old graveyard, where McFarland's monument now stands. The next church was of modern brick, built in 1832. But being without beauty, it was replaced by another in 1856, and the sexton's house was built in 1854. (The correct year is 1845) The first members of the church were Gabriel Walker, John Phillips and Samuel Stewart. The first person buried in the graveyard was Hannah Baldwin, on May 12, 1798. Some of the early elders of the church are listed below, with the years of election, and those which are underlined, are of the families which intermarried with the McMichaels of the area.

A considerable number of the early McMicals are buried in the old graveyard of this church, and they are listed herewith. The listing is in two sections:- the first section are those with headstones; the second section are from the old church records, but for whom there are no headstones. The numbers on the left, are the numbers assigned to them in this Series 8 of Work Sheets. Those without numbers, can not at the moment be positively identified, as to their position in the family chart. The dates of birth in most cases, have been computed from the date of death, less the age at death.

4B-2. Isaac McMichael (1756-1823), a son of James and Friscilla, died on Feb. 6, 1823, at the age of 67 years, and is buried with his wife in the Mt. Union Cemetery. According to the history book, he was married to Miss Mary Holtz; but according to the headstone, her name was Miriam Holtz. And Mrs. Hueserich has seen a deed, in which her name was given as Varion Holtz. Her years were 1761-1846, and she died on Sept. 21, 1846 at the age of 85 years. By the history book of the county, they are credited with 12 children, although it names but one, John.

The will of Miriam Holtz McMichael, was dated for Feb. 19, 1846, and it is found in the Allegheny County Court House, in Will Book 6, Page 175. It was signed by Hugh Cowan and John Reiss, and in it were named 6 of the 12 children. They are the first 6 on the list to follow, but not necessarily in the order of birth. The 7th child, is by Mrs. Hueserich. The 8th and last child on the list was added by the compiler. And there are sundry other bits of information from other sources.

Refer to Page 5, second paragraph:-- With reference to the 313 acres of land in the name of Isaac McMichael,--after his death, the land was divided equally between John (5B-7) and William (5B-8). Later, John bought up William's share, holding then, the entire original grant of 313 acres. On the death of John (5B-7), each of the three children (6B-19/21) received 55 acres, and the rest of the land was unaccounted for.

5B-7. John McMichael (1793-1853), a son of Isaac and Miriam, is buried with his wife in the Mt. Union Cemetery, and died on Jan. 31, 1853. He was born and raised on the family farm, and was a farmer himself. He married Miss Ann McMillen (1800-1845), who died on Aug. 9, 1845, at the age of 45 years. That is headstone data, and it is at variance with the history book, which states that she was born in 1815, and died in 1845, at the age of 30 years. I should prefer the headstone data. There were 3 children given---and there could scarcely have been more, in view of the early death of the mother.

5B-8. William McMichael (1805-1876), a son of Isaac and Miriam, was born in the month of March 1805, and died in 1876 at the age of 71 years. He was a captain in the Civil War, and he held mustering and recruited

men at his place, and the neighbors came from miles around, and helped to feed and quarter the men. There were huge brick ovens and clay ovens, in the yard, for baking and cooking, and Mrs. Jeffries remembers an old log cabin in the yard, which may have been a fort. (She states, that "my mother, Mrs. Eliza Jane (McMichael) Snedgrass (6E-27), and my two older brothers, Albert J. (7B-101) and William J. (7B-100) and myself, Martha Alma (Snedgrass) Jeffries (7B-103), visited there every year, and my brothers would dress up in grandfathers military regalia, even to the epaulets and swords.") Mrs. Schall, adds the note, that the log cabin, or fort, spoken of above, was erected by James McMichael, before the Revolution.

Captain William McMichael, was married to Miss Martha Walker Phillips who was born in January 1815, and who died in 1888, aged 73 years. She was the daughter of,-----

Alexander Phillips (1786-1869) and Mary Polly Sharp (1785-1859). He died on July 25, 1869, aged 83 years; she died Jan. 6, 1859, aged 74 years. Their children were Martha, Walker P., Samuel P., and William P. Alexander Phillips was the son of,-----

Samuel Phillips and his wife Margaret----- He lived in Robinson Township all of his life, and died there on Dec. 29, 1863. He was a weaver, and was an elder of his church from 1850. "The children died", but one son was the Alexander who is listed above. Samuel Phillips was the son of,-----

Jonathan Phillips and Hannah Cowan. He was born in Ireland in 1745 (or '47) and died on April 3, 1830, in his 84th year. She was born in 1746, and died in 1825. Both are buried in the old graveyard. Jonathan came to America in 1785, with his brother Samuel, and a sister, and settled in that portion of Washington County that is now Robinson Township of Allegheny County. Samuel the brother, served in the Revolutionary War, as a private in the Stockley Rangers. Jonathan Phillips was one of the first three Ruling Elders of his church, and served until his death.

There were eight children born to Capt. William and Martha W. (Phillips) McMichael, and they are listed herewith, as all being of Robinson Township, Allegheny County, Penn. Four of the children died in early life, and are buried in the Mt. Union Cemetery. They are Isaac (6E-25), Mary (6E-26), Margaret (6E-28), and Hannah (6E-29).

-13. Martha W. McMichael, a daughter of Isaac and Miriam, was born on -----, and died on Aug. 24, 1840. She was married to Mr. Jeremiah Penn, who was born on Dec. 7, 1776, and who died on Apr. 29, 1861.

(Of all the McMichael family groups which we have considered to this date, (the McMichaels of Allegheny County are the only group which have the (given name of Isaac in their listings. For this reason, and because of the proximity of the Coshocton area to the Pennsylvania homepage, I have (included him and his family in this listing.)

Of all their children, we have no knowledge; but two of them are buried with their parents, in Coshocton, and a third is now tied to the family, thru war papers, which have come to our attention.

Charles McMichael, the presumed son of Isaac and Ann McMichael, was born, in all probability, in Ohio, about the month of January, 1842, and he died in St. Louis, Missouri, on Dec. 2, 1866, aged 24 yrs. 11 mons., from an intestinal complaint which he contracted during the Civil War. He was enlisted out of Coshocton, Ohio, for service in the Civil War, on Sept. 11, 1861, and was mustered into the service at Canal Dover, on Oct. 3, 1861, as a Sergeant in Co. F., (Capt. J. W. Marshall), 51st Regiment (Col. McClain), of the Ohio Volunteers, for a term of 3 years. He received his discharge in Oct. 1864, at the expiration of his 3-yr. term of enlistment.

Charles McMichael was married at Coshocton, Ohio on Jul. 10, 1866, to Miss Mary Cochrane, by the Rev. James Henderson, a minister of the gospel. She was born about the year 1844, and died in St. Louis, on Feb. 7, 1869. Although they were married in Coshocton, Ohio, they appear to have removed to St. Louis immediately after the marriage, since their only child was born there,----

The child was born after the death of the father. So it was, that after the father's death, but some 3 months before the birth of the child, Mary (Cochrane) McMichael, the mother, petitioned the government, out of St. Louis, for a widow's pension, based on her marriage to a veteran of the Civil War. The petition was dated for Jan. 11, 1869. But she was destined to receive its benefits for only 2 yrs. in-as-much as she died on Feb. 7, 1869, leaving the child an orphan.

It would then appear, that Isaac McMichael (5B-14), father of the soldier, and grandfather of the orphan, left Ohio.

went west to St. Louis to secure the child, and then returned to Coshocton, where, on the 18th of Sept. 1869, he petitioned the government for an allowance, under the pension law, as the guardian of a child of a war veteran. At the time of this petition, Isaac gave his age as 66 years, and his death in 1877, again left the child without a home.

An examination of the probate records in Coshocton County, for an accounting of the guardianship, indicated that the allowance for Isaac, the grandfather, was made retroactive to June of 1868. This would indicate, that he did not await the death of the mother (Feb. 7, 1869), but went west at a time during her last illness, and prior to the date given above, June of 1868. He continued in the guardianship until December 1876, a month before his death, when a final accounting was made of the funds received and disbursed.

After the death of Isaac, the guardianship of the boy, (Charles Sherman McMichael), passed to one Mary Webb, appointed by the court; but the actual board and room was in the hands of one Lania McMichael, to whom the former paid the government money. The final accounting of Mary Webb, as guardian, was made on March 6, 1885, just before the boy's 18th birthday.

At the time of the death of the soldier, (Charles McMichael Sr., 6B-72), he was first buried in the city cemetery in St. Louis. But a report from the Depot Quartermaster's Office, in St. Louis, dated for May 13, 1869, records that the remains were removed from the above cemetery, and re-interred in the National Cemetery, at Jefferson Barracks, Missouri, in what appears to be Section 65, Grave 183. It is not stated whether his wife is in this or that cemetery.

6B-19. Isaac McMichael, the son of John and Ann, was born in 1835, and died on June 12, 1904, aged 69 years. Mr. McMichael was born and reared on his father's farm, and he inherited 55 acres of the land, as his portion of the estate. Later he purchased the 55-acre portions of the farm from both his brother John (6B-20) and his sister, Sarah Ann (6B-21) at the time when the latter two removed to North Fayette Township. (About 1872). Mr. McMichael was educated in the common schools, and, being left an orphan when quite young, was thrown among strangers, and was forced to make his own way. In 1854 he went to California, where he engaged in mining for nine years, and then returned to Allegheny County via Key West and New York. Mr. McMichael was a Democrat. He was married in the year 1876 to Miss Ella McCoy the daughter of John McCoy of this county. She died in the year 1931. There were 6 children,---

In the year 1957, Mable W. was still living in California; and in that year Ralph Cleveland was still living, in Carnegie, Penna.

He has always been a resident of this county, was educated in the Common Schools, and was engaged in farming and stock raising, except for one year in California. He was a school director for 6 years, and has also served as a supervisor. He was a Republican. In the year 1863, he was married to Miss Anna Ewing, born in 1842, the daughter of Capt. Samuel Ewing. Anna Eliza Ewing (her full name), died on Oct. 24, 1927.

At the time of his marriage, he and his wife lived in a new house and barn at Danwick, and remained there until 1872. In the previous year (1871) he purchased 337 acres, 72 perches of land, from James Eggs, in North Fayette Township, and later sold 192 acres of this land to his sister Sarah Ann McMichael (6B-21). And still later, he sold more of this land to the Pittsburgh Coal Company, where the town of Tyre now is situated.

The History of Allegheny County, from which we have quoted at various times, identified his wife as Nancy Jane Walker. But Mrs. Huserich has stated that she has seen a deed, wherein John's wife signed her name as Agnes--- In this connection, it is to be noted, that in a copy of a warranty deed, dated for July 13, 1839, and recorded on April 11, 1840, in Deed Book Vol. 60, Page 108, for 126 acres 82 perches of land, John and Nancy are the persons involved. But she signed her name as Agnes, and the attorneys who took out the copy, called attention to this difference in such a way, as to indicate that they are one and the same person.

John McMichael, was born in the year 1761, and died on Feb. 6, 1840, at the age of 79 years. That comes from the church records---but no stone was ever erected over his grave. He came to Allegheny County, Penna., with his parents, and a variety of dates may announce his arrival. He is said to have been 18 years of age when he came, which would make the year of his arrival, 1779. He was married in Allegheny County in 1795, and it is certain that he was here prior to 1787. He was a farmer and a surveyor, and held land in Robinson Township. He was married in May 1795, to Miss Nancy Jane Walker (1772-1849), the daughter of William Walker of this county, and granddaughter of Isaac Walker. The headstone on her grave in the Mt. Union Cemetery, states that she died on March 26, 1849, at the age of 77 years. There was no notation for her husband however, on the stone, so it is unknown just where in the cemetery he is buried.

There were 2 sons and 7 daughters born to this marriage, and we have their names from his will, which is found in Book 5, Page 165, under Allegheny County, at Pittsburgh. But it is to Mrs. Jones that we must give credit for the order of birth, and the dates of birth.

And he referred to certain coal lands, situate in Collier Township, and presently on lease to his son John C. (6C-384) and to his late son-in-law, W. M. Sturgeon (husband of Florence V. (6C-381)), and he directed that the royalties from the mines on those lands, were to be used to pay his debts, and that the balance left, was to be divided equally between his 4 children.

With respect to the son John C., and his brother-in-law, W. M. Sturgeon, there were several deeds to land, conveying the right to mine coal, to those two men, doing business as the Beechmont Coal Company. It is to be noted further, that the attorneys had made certain notations on the deeds, to show, that in the year 1934, Nancy J. was still living, Flora V. was still living, tho' her husband and children were dead. Their two grandchildren still lived. Maud died unmarried, intestate, and without issue.

One of our correspondents, Mrs. Nellie Hays Schall, of 519 Mifflin Ave., Pittsburgh, 21, Penn., has provided us with the following data, on several Collateral Lines of Descent, and on the following pages, the families are presented in outline form, to the point of intermarriage with the McMichael family.

The Lorain Family. The ancestry of a family line, for many old and prominent families of Robinson, Collier, and North Fayette Townships, in Allegheny County, Penn., Members of this family line, also intermarried several times with members of the Allegheny County McMichaels, with whom we are here concerned. By virtue of this descent, and since John Lorain was a soldier of the Revolution, many of the daughters of McMichael, born subsequently to the marriage, are eligible for membership in the Daughters of the American Revolution.

1L-1. Charles Lorain, the first of whom we have record, was married to Miss Jane McCain, a Scotch Highlander. At their death, they were buried in the Presbyterian Cemetery, at Kilenan, Ireland, and over their graves were placed gray tombstones, which can be seen to this day. They left one son:-

2L-2. Charles Lorain Jr., and to him were left the possessions on Lethshoal, Donegal, Ireland, to be his "while the water ran and the weeds grew." Also two ships. He was married to Miss Margaret McKinley, of Donegal, of Scotch-Irish descent, and to that union were born,---

3L-3. John Lorain, born 1755, and

3L-4. Charles Lorain III.

Charles Lorain Jr., taught his son John Lorain, all the arts and sciences of running the mariners compass. John followed the sea, making one trip in particular, to Norway for deal boards. But this trip ended in disaster, when the ship was sunk during a storm, off the coast of Norway. All on board were lost, but five. Among those lost was the father, Charles Jr.; among those saved was John, his son. Upon his return to Donegal, his mother informed him that they had lost their estate and ships, and declared her intention of going to America. John Lorain went with her, while his brother, Charles III, was sent to England for his schooling.

3L-3. John Lorain, after his arrival in America, became one of the soldiers of the Revolution, serving a total of 6 years and 7 months, the time being made up of two 3-year enlistments, and 7 months as gunner on board a ship. He was in the Battle of Peoli; he was at the Battle for Quebec, in late 1775, when he was taken prisoner, and held for about one month. His escape from parole, strangely enough, was attributed to his brother, when a chance encounter revealed him (Charles Lorain III), to be a Colonel in the British Army. John Lorain was also at the Battle of Long Island, on Aug. 27, 1776; at the Battle of Brandywine, on Sept. 11, 1777; at the Battle of Monmouth, on June 28, 1778, when he was wounded in the leg; and at the Battle of Stony Point, on the Hudson, with Ned Anthony Wayne, on July 16, 1779.

John Lorain, after his return from the wars, in 1783, at about the age of 28, was married, and secured employment as a schoolteacher, at Toms Run, near Pittsburgh. He also worked as a surveyor, and did occasional trading with the Indians. He was the owner of several small farms, which he later sold, and turned to one of 150 acres, at what is now Idlewood, near Crafton. He also received assistance as a pensioner, his claim being dated for July 31, 1820.

John Lorain was born in Ireland in 1755, and died in Pennsylvania, on Sept. 11, 1834, aged 79 years. He was married to Miss Mary Parker of Chester, Penn., born 1766 and died on June 11, 1814, aged 48 years. She was of the Quaker faith, and her marriage to an ex-soldier incurred the opposition of her father, and they were forced to elope. The marriage took place about the year 1788, and there were 9 children. One of them,----

4L-5. Parker Lorain (1792-1862), who was married to Elizabeth Stewart, whose date of death was March 14, 1887. She was the daughter of William Stewart, a Revolutionary Soldier, and Martha Walker; and the grand-daughter of Hugh Stewart of Harrisburg, Penn. There were five children listed for this marriage:-

5L-10. Martha Lorain, who married Robert Boyce.

6L-20. Parker Lorain Boyce (1826-1860)

5L-11. Mary Jane Lorain (1831-1893), who died on Apr. 18, 1893. She was married to Capt. Samuel Walker Ewing (1818-1894) who died on Feb. 1, 1894.

6L-21. Anna Eliza Ewing (1842-1927), who died on Oct. 24, 1927. She was married to Mr. JOHN McMICHAEL (6B-30) born 1842, and died on June 11, 1923.

5L-12. Margaret Lorain (1806-1893), who married Nelson Ewing, born Apr. 29, 1820, and died Jan. 10, 1902.

5L-13. Emiline Lorain, born Nov. 4, 1830, and died on Aug. 9, 1891. Married on Mar. 11, 1852, to Mr. William Vance Hays, he being born on Nov. 6, 1824, and died on June 29, 1902.

6L-22. Lewis Cass Hays, who married twice, 1st to Miss Flora Bendman, and 2ndly, to Miss Emma Whetstone.

5L-14. William Stewart Lorain, who married Julia Jamison. Under the terms of his father's will, dated for June 30, 1855, this son was to receive the farm, after the death of the mother, and his daughters were to have \$400. each. Mr. Lorain lived at Apollo, Armstrong County, Penn.
